







# **NEWS AND EVENTS ORGANISED**

The Department of Liberal Arts and Psychology at Manipal University Jaipur hosted a thought-provoking debate competition on November 26, 2024, titled "Technology to Women: Liberative or Oppressive?" # Dr. Trishna Chaudhuri's Innovative Patent for Safer Dating Apps

Manipal University Jaipur's groundbreaking patent application (No. 202511015858 A), filed on February 24, 2025 and published on March 14, 2025 in The Patent Office Journal (No. 11/2025), introduces a revolutionary system to enhance dating app safety. Developed by Dr. Trishna Chaudhuri and Himmat Das Charan, the invention titled "A System and Method for Enhancing Safety and Consent Awareness in Dating Applications" features AI-powered detection of harmful behaviour (85-95% accuracy), emergency SOS alerts, interactive consent training, and educational modules about healthy relationships. This 20-page patent with 7 claims represents a significant advancement in digital safety technology, showcasing the university's commitment to innovative solutions for pressing social challenges. The system's comprehensive approach addresses consent awareness, harassment prevention, and user education, potentially transforming the online dating landscape.





# **RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS**

### Groundbreaking Study Reveals Music's Power to Combat Stress

Published in Empirical Economics Letters (23(Special Issue 2), September 2024; DOI: 10.5281/zenodo.14415535; ISSN 1681-8997), a pioneering study by Dr. Anjalee Narayan (Manipal University Jaipur) and Dr. Rashmi Srivastava (Dayalbagh Educational Institute) demonstrates music's profound impact on stress reduction. The research, involving 240 participants (120 academic scholars and 120 professionals from NCR Delhi), revealed that structured music therapy sessions reduced anxiety by 54.28% in the intervention group—significantly outperforming the control group's 25% reduction. Key techniques included personalized playlists, raga-based therapy (e.g., Raga Bhairavi and Yaman), and rhythmic breathing exercises, with Hindustani/Carnatic music showing exceptional efficacy. The study highlights music's dual role in alleviating physiological (lowered cortisol, heart rate) and (improved emotional psychological stress particularly for stress rooted in personal relationships. Future research directions neuroimaging, explore AI-driven personalization, and cross-cultural applications. This work underscores music as a scalable, non-invasive tool for stress management, offering actionable insights for individuals and healthcare systems alike.






### STUDENT AWARDS AND INNOVATIONS

A first-year liberal arts student, Shambhavi Pareek participated in a sustainability-focused study tour at Ajman University, gaining hands-on experience in global approaches to sustainable development.
